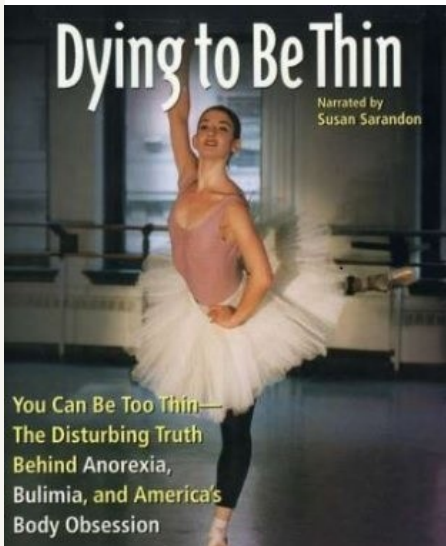


Documentary and Discussion - CEUs available

Laura Huff, PhD, will deliver a clinical presentation exploring factors that contribute to eating disorders, assessment considerations, and current research on best practices. With expertise in eating disorder research, treatment and training, Dr. Huff currently serves as the Director of the Eating Disorders Program at St. Louis Behavioral Medicine Institute.

Clinical content will include:

- Neurobiological underpinnings and the role of the brain
- Assessment strategies to determine appropriate level of care
- Identification of clients' Maintenance Factors and strategic opportunities for intervention
- Updates on adolescent and adult treatment
